

HHP Activities

Throughout the year, the POA's Activities Department plans a wide variety of exciting activities and events for the diverse population of the Plantation. They include special events, seminars, classes, workshops and much more. The activities are held at various POA facilities.

We pride ourselves in the ability to provide and meet the needs of the different age groups that comprise the Hilton Head Plantation community. For the youth of the Plantation, a summer recreation program – Kids Kamp – is held each summer. In addition, a variety of Clubs are available for participation by all Plantation residents. Detailed information of Plantation and Club activities is available in the Plantation Living newsletter.

Trips

Cultural and entertaining trips are planned throughout the year for the community. They include trips to the Savannah historic district and River Street, Charleston shopping and historic area, football games, and much more.

Nature Series

Throughout the year various nature seminars, walks, and beach explorations are planned as well as special trips to various barrier islands, kayaking excursions and dolphin watch boat trips. They are informative and fun for residents of all ages.

Classes

Many classes are held on a year-round basis, e.g., Low Impact Aerobics, Strength Training, Tai Chi, Yoga, Pilates, and Water Aerobics. Special classes are held at various times of the year, e.g., water aerobics, bridge, dog obedience, AARP Driver Safety Program, Red Cross lifeguard training, scrap booking, beauty, creating cards and gifts, lifeguard and aerobics instructor certification programs, plus whatever other classes that may be of interest to the residents.

Seminars

Interesting, cultural, fun and exciting seminars are planned for the residents throughout the year. Some of these are the Cooking Live Series, insurance, medical, historic, ecology, nature, fitness, and travel seminars.

Discount Theatre Programs

Local playhouses offer a wide variety of Broadway-quality entertaining plays at special-discounted rates for our residents. They are able to enjoy exciting performances throughout the year at a reasonable price without going to a metropolitan city for the experience. All are advertised in *Plantation Living* newsletter.

Special Events

Throughout the year, the Department plans special events for the entire community. Some of the events are: Easter Sunrise Service, Trash & Treasure Sales, indoor and outdoor concerts (Music & Sunset), Hilton Head Plantation Day – July 4th, children's parties, Halloween Pet Parade, holiday parties, Wine & Cheese Parties, Memorial Day Pool Cookouts (oyster roasts, shrimp boils, etc.), and much more. KIDS KAMP

The Kids Kamp Program is held each summer for children and youths of the Plantation in grades K-8. The children enjoy field activities, crafts, swimming, music, cooking, special events and much more. All activities take place in Spring Lake Pavilion, deck and playground area, Spring Lake Pool, and recreation fields. Hours for the Program are 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Application forms are available at the POA Service Center and Plantation House.

Established in 1987, KIDS KAMP has grown to accommodate more than 300 of our Plantation children each summer. Enrollment is open to children who will be entering grades K-8 and who are Hilton Head Plantation residents or guests. Based at the Spring Lake Recreation Area, our expansive Kamp grounds provide a safe and comfortable environment where Kampers can play, learn, and grow together.

Children are grouped according to age and grade. Each group's Counselor Team plans the daily activities according to a weekly theme and the group's ability. Previous themes include Around the World Week, Mystery Week, It's Showtime Week, Tropical Island Week, Olympic Week, and Holiday Week. On Wacky Wednesdays, all Kampers and staff show off their creativity by dressing according to the theme. On Fridays, the entire Kamp comes together for a special event to wrap up the week with an exciting theme activity. Regularly scheduled activities include swimming, arts & crafts, performing arts, field games, fishing. Cooking, music, and nature are also incorporated into group schedules.

KIDS KAMP Registration

You may register your child at the POA Service Center for the entire KIDS KAMP (8 weeks) or for one or more weeks. Pre-registration, which occurs in March, offers reduced rates. A non-refundable deposit is required at pre-registration; the balance is due by May 1st. After March 30th, children may be registered at the regular rate on a space-available basis. Full payment is due at registration.

KIDS KAMP Refund Policy

The non-refundable deposit will be deducted from all refunds, regardless of when the deposit, partial, or full payment occurs, because the deposit assures a space for your child thus excluding another child. A full refund, less the non-refundable deposit, will be processed within 30 days if the child is withdrawn prior to the start of Kamp. Once Kamp begins, the refund will be pro-rated based on the child's attendance at Kamp.

KIDS KAMP Sponsorship

The HHP Forum for the Humanities Committee, now disbanded, has program money available to sponsor two children for two weeks in the HHP Summer KIDS KAMP Program. To be eligible, the children's parents must be property owners and demonstrate financial need. The HHP Recreation Committee will determine who will be awarded the sponsorships.

Summer Job Opportunities

Again this year, the Activities Department will be hiring KIDS KAMP counselors and lifeguards. Counselors should be college students majoring in Recreation or Early Childhood Education. Previous camp experience is preferred, but not required. Employment begins in mid-June and ends mid-August. The Counselors' workweek is Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., approximately 27 hours per week. Lifeguards, Shift Supervisors, and Head Guards should have current Red Cross Certification, CPR, and WSI and be at least 18 years old. Lifeguards work 30 to 40 hours per week. Previous supervisory experience is required for Supervisors.

Tennis At Its Best

If you have a few minutes when you are visiting the Spring Lake Recreation Area, come browse around the Tennis Complex. Everyone is very hospitable, and the tennis players love an audience. At the Spring Lake parking lot, there is a modest sign and a tabby path, easily overlooked because of the beautiful shrubbery. Come see what we have to offer. There are gazebos with benches and chairs to relax out of the sun, two sets of bleachers to view the action on the courts, a Pro Shop with friendly, accommodating staff who would love to answer your questions or just chat. And, of course, there are always plenty of matches to watch on the 12 beautifully maintained Har-Tru courts.

Have you met Keith Ferda, the Tennis Pro? Give Keith five minutes and he is your best pal or your most helpful instructor. His staff in the Pro Shop is equally helpful and pleasant. Any one of them can tell you about the various tennis events. For example, each week of every month, there are Round Robins – Men on Monday, Ladies on Tuesday, Mixed on Friday. Every month, there is a Saturday Round Robin complete with a social event, such as a White Elephant, St. Patty's Day Bash, Ice Cream Social, etc. If you need a reason to visit the tennis facility, come join the fun during the annual Wimbledon Week, which is capped off with the traditional Champagne & Strawberries & Cream, plus an Awards Dinner. Spring Lake Tennis is an active participant in the USTA leagues with more than 21 teams and in the Interclub Competition as well. There have been teams that have advanced to the State as well as the National Championships.

For all the fun, exercise, competition, and companionship, there is a fee, which is extremely competitive with other tennis facilities in other plantations. The Spring Lake dues are used exclusively for operating the tennis facility.

The purpose of the Yacht Club is to promote good fellowship among its members. This is accomplished by holding regular monthly meetings with varied, informative programs and refreshments and with an active schedule of boating and social events. It is a source of pride within the Yacht Club that 85% of its members actively participate in the operation of the Club. There are two classifications of members. Boating members are those residents who currently own boats and maintain them in Hilton Head waters. Social members are residents who have had boating experience but do not currently own a boat or they maintain a boat outside of Hilton Head waters.

Our by-laws have recently been updated to increase our membership from 150 to 160 of which 65 may be social members. Since each membership represents one household, there are many singles as well as couples. A Commodore and an enthusiastic eleven-person Board of Governors, who are elected each year by the members, lead the Club. We are known as a "fun" group and work very hard to maintain our reputation by holding two formal dinner dances each year - the Commodore's Ball in May and the Change of Watch in December when we install our new Board of Governors. In addition, good food and spirits can be enjoyed at our Welcome Back BBQ in September and at other activities, such as wine tastings, jazz brunches, St. Pat's celebrations, Mardi Gras party, pizza nights, and Halloween festivities. We also enjoy luncheon cruises to places assessable by boat or by car, such as the Dockside in Port Royal, the Quarterdeck at Harbourtown, the Savannah Yacht Club, and the Savannah Westin. The heartier boaters participate in several overnight cruises each year to destinations, including Beaufort, Charleston, Dataw Island, Bohicket, St. Simons, and Jekyll Island. Those who want longer trips can always find fellow boaters to join them in cruises south to Florida and the Bahamas or to the colder waters of the north. Members can also soak up the sun with raft-ups at Bay Point or along the May River sandbar. Our sailors enjoy an active race program. A series of races are scheduled in both spring and fall bringing out our avid sailors and a substantial support crew of power boaters. Awards are given at the end of each racing season and at the end of the year. Racing seminars are sometimes given to captains and crews to review race rules and discuss techniques. Practice sessions for race starts are given in Calibogue Sound with experienced sailors instructing newer racers in starting strategies.

We encourage our boaters to share the "on the water" experience by offering to transport social members on our outings and by offering an "Invitation to Sail" aboard our sailing vessels in the spring. We hold a "fishing event" each year to encourage our fishermen and would-be fishermen in a friendly competition. This year we hope to include a supervised opportunity for boaters to try out their emergency signals. We also plan to bless the entire fleet on a spring day in Port Royal Sound. Kids Fishing Tournament

The KIDS FISHING TOURNAMENT – sponsored by the Fishing Club – is held each year on a Sunday afternoon for HHP boys and girls through 13 years of age. This Catch-and-Release Fishing Tournament is held at the Kids Lagoon, located next to the POA Service Center. The fees are \$1.00 per child before a pre-determined date, or \$2.00 thereafter. Volunteers are always needed to register participants, to record and measure fish, and to have a great excuse to watch a thoroughly enjoyable event. Tournament Rules & Regulations

Only children may fish during the tournament; however, adults may provide minimal assistance and are encouraged to attend.

Participants may fish all or part of the time.

Each participant must submit an application form and \$1.00 fee during pre-registration or \$2.00 if registering after that time.

Participants must attend the Tournament and Awards Presentation to be eligible for prizes.

The Fishing Club Marshal will measure and count all catches.

All fish must be released after being recorded.

Winning catches is determined by length and/or total number of fish as determined by Tournament Directors. Judges decisions are final.

Tournament Equipment and Bait

Participants should bring their equipment.

Only one fishing rod or pole per participant is allowed. The Fishing Club has a limited number of poles and tackle available for use by participants who do not have their own equipment.

These are cane poles with fixed lines and floats.

Participants must use barbless hooks. Please flatten any barbs with pliers before the Tournament.

Entrants may use other natural bait such as worms, grubs, shrimp, mud minnows, and crickets.

No artificial lures are allowed due to the crowded conditions. The Club will have worms and catfish bait available.

Turkey Trot

The Turkey Trot is a great family event and open to all HHP residents. The Turkey Trot, sponsored by the Island Recreation Center, consists of a two-mile walk, a 5k run, and a 10k run. Each event starts at the Boathouse Grill – outside the Cypress Gate – at 8:00 a.m. on Thanksgiving morning. Runners and walkers pass through the Cypress Gate, walk or run on Seabrook Drive to the Dolphin Head Recreation Area, and then return to the finish line at the Cypress Gate.
