2024 Budget

As is the Board's long-standing process, in late May, the Board and Staff started the process that culminated with the adoption of the 2024 Budget. In September, the HHP Board adopted a budget for 2024 that projects an increase in your annual assessment of \$30.00 for the year. The assessment for 2024 has been set at \$1,317 if you pay by credit card and \$1,291 if you pay by cash or check for an improved lot. For an unimproved lot it will be \$790 if you pay by credit card and \$775 if you pay by cash or check. Again, this translates to a \$30.00 annual increase (\$2.58 per month) or 2.38% for 2024 for improved lot owners paying by check or cash.

The process of assembling the budget is a year-long process that begins earnestly with a review of the Board's adopted five-year Strategic Plan. In June of each year, the HHP Board adopts specific guidelines for staff to use in compiling the budget. Based on these guidelines, the Department Heads develop their individual department budgets. The General Manager and the Assistant General Manager review this work, and predictably, changes are made to the Department Head's submission. The Department Head must defend every line to the General Manager and the Assistant General Manager. The draft is refined, and a meeting consisting of the Department Head, the General Manager, the Assistant General Manager, and the Chair of the committee (who is a POA Board member) in that discipline is constituted. Each specific area of the proposed budget is scrutinized in this manner. After these meetings have been held and appropriate adjustments have been made, the draft budget is sent to the Finance Committee. Further adjustments are made as necessary based on this input. The process culminates with a thorough review by the Board and still further adjustments as necessary to the bottom line.

The Labor Market is still very tight in our area as traffic and availability of willing workers play into our ability to attract and retain both full-time and part-time employees. Although inflationary forces have abated somewhat, the cost of fuel, along with goods and services, have not remained depressed. Continued supply chain concerns also place a premium on many products, along with delivery delays resulting in substantial wait times for materials needed for projects. We continue to wait for parts and components that are in short supply or are manufactured overseas.

Some revenue cost centers remained steady, such as Special Events and Classes. Tennis memberships, Kids Kamp, *Plantation Living* Advertising, RV/Boat Storage area fees, and Commercial pass revenue again increased as these services were sought after by property owners, their guests, and vendors. We renovated the RV Boat Storage facility and reorganized the area. (*continued on page 5*)

From the President's Desk

Challenges include the continued uncertainty of inflation, increased insurance costs, a competitive labor market, and the opening of Dolphin Head. On September 26, the Board approved the recommendation of the Finance Committee and management's 2024 Budget, which, despite the challenges, will result in a nominal 2.38% increase in our annual assessment.

The Dolphin Head project was delayed a bit longer into the early part of this month, but we are now performing our final walkthroughs and working on getting the necessary permits to open it up! Peter's column has more detail regarding the specifics, but in addition to the facility being completed, our Recreation Committee recommended, and the Board approved, guidelines to manage our new basketball/pickleball courts, as well as a plan to make the building available to our clubs and others. Watch for the announcement of the grand opening.

On September 28, a very well-attended coffee with Peter was held with guests Mayor Alan Perry and Town Manager Marc Orlando. They updated us on town operations, workforce housing, 278 corridor improvements, Main Street plans, the Town's park projects, and beach renourishment on the Island. We were delighted to receive a pat on the back on our Dolphin Head and Pine Island project. They answered questions from the audience as well. Our next coffee is scheduled for November 16 and will be a celebration of the 50th Anniversary of the POA.

This month's edition contains an article indicating how to submit your Board Interest Form if you are interested in serving on the Board. Please consider serving in this important role.

Lastly, we should not forget that Hurricane season is not yet over, stay prepared. And on Halloween, be vigilant and watch out for our local trick-or-treaters.

2024 Budget

Our Reserve Funds, Weather Casualty Fund, and Capital Fund are in a sound fiscal position as 2023 winds down. Although not totally under control, inflation and labor shortages have abated to a degree. The current costs of keeping HHP well maintained, and the many services that you have come to expect are all contained in the adopted 2024 Budget. Much of our almost seven (7) million-dollar operating budget is composed of salaries. The Board, in order to attract and keep present employees, provided funds for merit salary increases for staff. Because of our continued practice of allowing you to pay your assessment with a credit card in 2023, the Board has set the assessment to account for the transaction fee imposed by our credit card company. However, there is a discount if your assessment is paid by cash or check. The assessment increase for 2023 will be \$30 or \$2.38 per month, which is a 2.587% increase over 2023.

Dolphin Head Project

The Dolphin Head Renovation Project continues. The kitchen countertops have been replaced with the proper selection. The siding has been installed on the exterior of the Recreation Building and is in the process of being painted. Inside trim work has been completed, and the painters are applying the finish interior coat. The screened porch is being framed. The flooring in the main room has been installed. The landscaping for the grounds and the artificial turf has been installed on the event lawn. Lots of miscellaneous work is being completed as we head towards the finish line. Nix Construction asked for and has been granted a completion extension for October 14, 2023. We are anticipating a Grand Opening on the afternoon of November 16, 2023.

We do not anticipate the new Dolphin Head Rec facilities will be available for club activities or private rental events until at least December 2023. Please check with Jen Westerfeld at the Plantation House on this availability.

RV/Boat Storage Area

We transferred responsibility for the management of the RV/Boat Storage Area to Community Relations Specialist Williette Lee. Williette has taken on her new responsibilities with a passion, as the area has been subjected to extensive renovation and reorganization. Williette has instituted new protocols for accountability to keep individuals that do not have a bonified lease out of the area. We are dealing with about a dozen items that are either abandoned or no owner

has been identified. We are working with our legal counsel on these items. Now that we have all the Property Owners with signed leases back in the RV/Boat Storage area, Williette is going through the waitlist. I have asked Williette to perform a comparative market analysis on what others charge for similar storage space, and we will adjust the rates accordingly for 2024. If you have an item that was in the RV/Boat Storage area without a lease or a renewed lease, your item has been moved to a temporary holding area. These items will be advertised as possibly abandoned in Plantation Living and possibly other publications. If no one comes forward, they will be sold or discarded. Only Property Owners are eligible to use the RV/Boat Storage area.

We sincerely appreciate everyone's patience as we worked through the many facets of this reorganization process. With new accountability measures in place, we hope many spaces will now become available for those recently waiting for a space in this facility. If you have any questions or realize that a boat, trailer, or RV may have been in the RV/Boat Storage area without a signed lease and has gone missing, please contact Willette Lee at Wlee@hhppoa.org of 842 681-800 ext. 242 as she may have information on the item's location.

Friendly Reminder

The Speed Limit in HHP is 25 mph unless otherwise posted. Please do not tailgate, please observe all stop signs, watch for pedestrians and cyclists, and use your turn signals. The HHP Security Officers write State of South Carolina Traffic Citations, which carry a hefty fine (and put points on your license). Please observe the rules of the road and drive safely.

Alligators and Other Critters

We need to observe all wildlife from a safe distance, limit close contact, and refrain from feeding the wildlife. Here is a non-inclusive list of safety tips: Do not walk too close to the water's edge of any of our lagoons, walking your pet too close to the edge of the shoreline is more ill-advised, never let your pet swim in a lagoon, never swim in a lagoon yourself or have anyone under your supervision swim in a lagoon, Golfers, if your ball lands next to a lagoon edge consider taking the stroke as alligators can misjudge a golf ball to be one of their favorite foods "eggs." Never feed an Alligator or any wildlife, for that matter. Fish, birds, and other animals are food for alligators. Be conscious of that fact when fishing around our lagoons. Never get into an argument with an alligator about a fish that is on the end of your line...let the gator have the fish! If you feel an alligator is aggressive, please report the concern to Security at 843-681-2459, and they will make a determination. Alligators that are deemed aggressive can not be relocated and are destroyed. Feeding an alligator is a death sentence for an alligator. Once a gator associates humans with food, they lose their fear of humans. Other critters like raccoons and opossums are assumed to carry rabies, and although these critters look cute if you are bitten, the treatment is often a very difficult regimen of rabies treatments. When gardening, wear gloves, long pants, and a long-sleeved shirt to discourage snake bites, ticks, and other ground-loving critters. Security Officers are trained to move nonaggressive

alligators from pools, front and rear yards, patios, garages, etc. In these situations, when the gator is just wandering around and not aggressive, Security will capture the gator and move it back to a lagoon or wooded area.

Please be cautious, err on the side of Safety, and use common sense.

This opened up additional spaces for leases and allowed us to increase rental costs, which consequently raised more revenue. The 2024 budgeted revenue also includes all the new homes at The Charles and two (2) of the homes in Waterway Gardens, which will pay the full improved assessment. This is a shift in revenue classification from commercial assessments to residential assessments. Interest rates have changed significantly as the Fed takes measures to slow rising inflation. This move has provided the POA with additional investment revenue not realized in years past. Due to the Board's and Town's investment in infrastructure improvements, Wi-Fi, cell phone service, and Airport improvements, residents continued to choose Hilton Head Plantation for their new home. We continue to see many homes turn over and many homeowners updating. Plantation Living advertising, took off in 2023. Tennis lessons were a more substantial source of revenue as we have added teaching and administrative staff to assist with the additional programming, including a Pickle Ball Professional. We have increased revenue projections for the Dolphin Head Rec Center as this facility is almost back online with a much greater potential rental capability.

The Board has kept merit salary increases to a 5% pool. As we are keenly aware, attracting and retaining quality employees has been and continues to be a challenge in many parts of the county. Insurance costs have also been raised upward to reflect market forces in this service. The Hilton Head area is no exception to this phenomenon. Inflation bit into the cost of goods and services, including fuel, oil, lumber, and other supplies.

The Landscape Maintenance contract will remain flat for 2024 as agreed to by the Board and Palmetto Coast Landscaping in our new landscaping contract agreement. We continued to budget the new Spring Lake Pool to reflect a larger and more complex facility based on our 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023 experiences. This year we were forced to operate with less than optimal staffing levels. We reverted to Year-Round Pool for our Pool Maintenance Service after our previous vendor did not uphold our cleanliness standards. Consequently, the line item for pool maintenance and chemicals was marked up significantly for 2023, however, chemical usage was not as much as anticipated, and we are marking this line down for 2024. Due to our partnership with the Town of Hilton Head for stormwater maintenance, we could again maintain our Operating Budget and Repair and Replacement Budgets for repairs in this area. The 2024 Budget includes additional funds for revetment and any work associated with protecting the up-land adjacent to the Pine Island Boardwalk.

We are expecting Commercial Insurance policies to continue to be a major concern for the immediate future. In 2023, we experienced some significant increases in the D&O (Directors and Officers Insurance) and General Liability policies. We anticipate these to increase again in 2024, especially with adding the new Dolphin Head Recreation clubhouse and playground.

We have determined that it will be necessary to allocate 15% of our assessment income and \$100,000 from our gate fees to the Repair and Replacement Fund. This process is needed to keep our roadways, leisure paths and other assets in good repair and on a timetable for an appropriate replacement. The staff has updated the Repair and Replacement Fund's schedule to reflect newly added assets to the POA in 2023. In addition, the line in the Repair and Replacement Budget for leisure paths remains elevated to the \$40,000 level to increase the maintenance of this very popular amenity. We also increased the line item in the operating budget for Leisure Path maintenance. Part time Staff additions have been budgeted for the Maintenace and Recreation departments to assist with the anticipated additional needs for Scheduling for the new Dolphin Head Facility, more demand for teaching for both Tennis and Pickle Ball and the scheduling for the three new hard surface Pickle ball courts and the additional maintenance required.

Our meetings are great social events with great food and a wide variety of speakers covering many natural science issues. Our speakers have represented the SC Department of Natural Recourses, The Birds Of Prey Organizations, the Island Packet, The Port Royal Sound Foundation, local fishing guides, and many others.

Our Club presidents serve two-year terms. On one occasion, back in 2006, no one stepped forward to take on the position. The then-current president, Dave Morse, reluctantly agreed to serve an additional term..... and another,and another until he had led the Club for twelve years. You might say, gee, it took him a long time to get it right! In fact, just the opposite. Dave was going to be a tough act to follow and be compared to. Unfortunately, Dave and Bev are leaving Hilton Head, and he won't be around to stir the Fishing Club pot any longer. Dave, we will miss you more than we can say. Thank you on behalf of the entire Club Membership.

Last month, we described fishing at the creek inlet at Pine Island (Dolphin Head). That inlet supplies salt water to three ponds in the community. Most residents are familiar with Spring Lake and Bear Lake. The third is less visible and less well known: Wild Turkey Run Lagoon. That area was the subject of discussion by an ad hoc organization called The Wild Turkey Run Task Force. After much discussion, the area was considered to be ecologically sensitive, and POA permission was required to enter the area. The problem was silt deposition. That pretty much put an end to fishing in that lagoon, but, unfortunately, Mother Nature never stopped the silt deposition. Wild Turkey Run Lagoon seems to have become a marsh with very little open water. Both Bear Lake and Spring Lake have weirs to control levels. Only at the peak of high tide does water overflow the weirs, and as the tide ebbs, the weirs maintain the lake levels. Wild Turkey Run Lagoon has no way to control levels so there is flow inward starting at the turn of the tide and flow back out all the way to dead low. Much more water movement moves much more solid material to deposit. The end of what was once a great fishing opportunity in HHP.



HHP Dog Club

Last month, more than a dozen canines and their humans gathered on the PH porch for a presentation by Alison Armao, owner of the training facility, Leader of the Pack. She answered questions about behavior issues and offered training tips and techniques, a few of which are listed below:



- 1. Harnesses actually encourage pulling. For training, use a collar and leash.
- 2. The heel position is when the dog's shoulder is next to the human's left leg.
- 3. When teaching a new command, begin in the house, then outside, then in the presence of other dogs.
- 4. Say heel, walk a few steps, then do a quick pivot, then walk a few steps, then heel, etc. Give treat.
- 5. By walking with the dog in heel position, the canine trusts you to handle what's ahead. If you walk with a dog ahead, it is faced with having to deal with what is ahead, and this adds to the canine's anxiety.
- 6. To address barking, give the command to sit or down to change focus, then say "quiet" and touch the top of the muzzle. No treat when correcting a misbehavior.
- 7. Overcoming bad behaviors takes extensive training. 8. There is no such breed as a Fighting Dog. Any breed can be taught to be compliant, and any breed can be taught to fight.
- 9. To eliminate jumping, use come/sit repeatedly, rewarding each time with treats or praise.
- 10. A dog that persists in jumping up is not getting enough mental stimulation and/or exercise.
- 11. Come is the most important command. When the dog comes to you at the command, throw a party, shower the canine with praise, affection, treats.
- 12. "Treats" can be ordinary kibble during extensive training; avoid too many rich treats.
- 13. Training sessions should last no more than 20 minutes.
- 14. Consider using a vibration collar for training, but not a shock collar.
- 15. Mental stimulation can be provided by toys with kibble hidden inside.

Woodcarvers

Are you looking for a hobby that allows you to create beautiful keepsakes or practical items without spending hundreds of dollars just on getting started? Wood carving checks all of those boxes. It is a type of woodworking in which people use knives, chisels, and other hand-held wood carving tools to create figures or designs in pieces of wood. A wood carver's most basic tools are carving knives, such as whittling knives, chip carving knives, and hook knives. Whittling knives are all-purpose tools, while chip carving knives feature a thin, short blade that allows carvers to chip away small bits of wood. A hook knife, or spoon knife, has a bent blade shaped like a hook and is ideal for carving spoons and other pieces with hollowed-out areas. Most woodcarvers start by whittling. They find a small piece of softwood and use a pocket knife to create a toy or a trinket. Whittling is the most basic type of wood carving since the only essential tools are a wood carving knife and a honing strop. Chip carving starts with a flat piece of wood. Carvers "chip away" bits of wood to form a design on the wood's surface. Chip carvers use gouges as well as carving knives. Most woodcarvers do not build or repair furniture. They work on a much smaller scale. Come and visit with us at the Plantation House on Thursdays from 12:30 to 2:30. See if you might be "cut out" to be a woodcarver. Your grandkids will benefit from your newfound skill.

Today's Lesson:

One of PB's common topics is noise due to the sound of the wiffleball hitting the paddle. In research tests from 100 ft. pickleball is 70 dBA (decibels), while tennis is 40. For comparison, basketball and a dishwasher also have a 70 dBA level. As communities develop new courts, the rule of thumb is for any court more than 600 feet from other activities or buildings; noise will be a non-issue. Many communities indicate that PB noise is really a non-issue. There was one exception: a new community in Utah had several residents file a noise complaint with their POA. There was no mention of ball noise; the complaint stated, 'everyone is having too much fun'.





Tired of having dull kitchen knives to work with? Well, here's your opportunity to get your knives and scissors sharpened as the Activities Department will be teaming up with Tom Stevens of Sharper Edges on Monday,



two separate Knife Sharpening Events. There will be limited appointments available (ONLY 25 spots per day) so reserve your spot today by calling Jen at the Scheduling Office at 843-681-8090. Those who have made an appointment will be asked to drop off their knives at the Plantation House from 8:30 AM to 11:00 AM on the day of their appointment.

Please bring items wrapped in a towel or market bag so Tom can easily keep things organized. Also be sure to leave a good contact number with Tom as he will text or call you when your items are complete and ready for pick up later that same day. There is a maximum of 5 items per RSVP, with a minimum of 3 items, but scissors can be additional to the 5 items. Dull edges are dangerous! So, we want you to have happy, sharper edges.

Items sharpened:

Knives, scissors/shears (both household/fabric/industrial and stylist/groomers), and garden implements (clippers, loppers, etc.).

Tom will take stylist/grooming shears with him to sharpen, and then he will deliver/return them the next day. Household, fabric, industrial type scissors will be completed at the event.

Pricing:

Pricing is variable as Tom will need to view the items. You will pay him directly. Kitchen knives average about \$15 each, though it varies with length, condition of edge, broken points, etc. Garden clippers and loppers range from \$5-\$20+, again dependent upon condition of edge, length, etc. Household scissors approximately \$15+, stylist/grooming shears \$35+. Bring your items and Tom will assess them. Cash, Checks and Credit Cards are accepted - Cash is king.

Tom's background information: Tom has been hand sharpening his own and family/friends' knives since he was 13 years old. He has advanced to a nifty belt sharpening system, and he is at a whole new level! He has been doing Sharpening Events and Farmers Markets on Hilton Head Island, Bluffton, and Port Royal for 3+ years and getting great results with many repeat customers.
