The Board has set the assessment amount to account for the transaction fee imposed by our credit card company. However, there is a discount if paid by cash or check. A letter from our General Manager

2023 in Review

With the pandemic clearly in our rear-view mirror, we welcomed 2023 with the Dolphin Head Renovation project underway after finally clearing all the permitting hurdles, including an archaeological dig for artifacts. Part of the work area was the site of the original Myrtle Bank Plantation complex. The recovered artifacts will be displayed in the new Dolphin Head Recreation facility. This new compound, which opened officially on November 16, 2023, was the culmination of years of planning. The final cost roughly \$4 million and includes an integrated pathway system, a new multigenerational and inclusive playground, a hard surface court for both basketball, pickleball, and other games, a new picnic shelter, fire pit, expanded parking, dog station, trellis, event lawn, and of course a new building with an expansive deck that sits on the Port Royal sound. If you have not visited this site, it is a must see. The building is now open for club activities and private rentals based on availability.

Besides Dolphin Head, renovations to our leisure paths and roadways were tackled. Due to many folks choosing to relocate to our area, Hilton Head Plantation continued to see ticked up Real Estate Sales even with the unfortunate consequence of rising interest rates. Along with higher interest rates came higher home prices, which continued to fuel our Capital Fund, which paid for the Dolphin Head Project without the need for a special assessment. We are tracking end-of-year budget results for 2023, and we are fairly confident that when the 2023 audit is completed, it will show a significant positive variance to the budget, which has been earmarked by the Board to completely pay off the Dolphin Head Project without the need to borrow internally from ourselves short term.

We tackled a total renovation of the RV Boat Storage area and cleared out many delinquent and abandoned items. This process opened many more spaces in the storage area and increased this amenity's value as a revenue source. A new, more secure gate for the entrance to this area will be installed that includes better accountability and video surveillance to help track those who may seek entrance illegally. We have made several announcements regarding items abandoned in the RV/Board Storage area, as rent is owed on these items. We will hold these items until December 31, 2023, and if unclaimed by someone who will accept accountability and provide proof of ownership, they will be disposed of in an appropriate manner.

The Security Department has stepped up speeding and stop sign enforcement. The Department now wears bodycams for your protection and theirs, as well as another layer of accountability. Two semi-permanent speed boards were installed on Whooping Crane Way and Santa Maria Drive. Another more portable device has been purchased and will be deployed at hot spot locations throughout the Property.

Our Kids Kamp program had to be capped again this year

as demand once again exceeded our capacity. Our Tennis program expanded its league and teaching offerings as well as experimenting with the lining of two clay courts with additional lines for four Pickle Ball Courts.

"The Charles," a condominium developed on the site of the Old Fort Pub, is now wholly occupied, and "Waterway Gardens" has two units occupied. The Pine Island sand scraping project received additional attention due to the misunderstanding that Park Creek, which empties into the Port Royal Sound between Pine Island and Ribaut Island, was the subject of a dredging project from beginning to end. This contention was totally erroneous. We are hopeful that this project will be approved after this was made clear at a DHEC Hearing. Our project merely moves the sand that the POA (you as property owners) paid for by trucking in sand from an upstate location to be moved from the Northwest corner of Pine Island to the Pine Island Isthmus. This very popular amenity is under the constant forces of natural erosion and needs a regular source of approved sand at a reasonable expense. We need to protect this amenity so it will continue to be accessible to all property owners, serve as an ecological barrier to the entire marsh, and protect our vital stormwater management outfall.

This year, we celebrated our 50th anniversary. As part of that recognition, all the past presidents who could be located were interviewed so they could share what they felt were their most valued contributions during their term in office. These video vignettes were compiled and served as one of the backdrops to our formal celebration held on November 16th. HHP has been fortunate to have so many volunteers who continue giving their time and talent for all the right reasons. I have spoken to many board members from other communities over my 35 years of being involved with community association management, and yes, it is a commitment of time and talent. What have I found most remarkable and unique about most of HHP's board members? They signed on for two terms, and some have sought a third after taking off the mandatory year. Far too often, I come across board members from other large communities who can't wait to serve one term and get off the Board due to the nonstop complaining and member dissatisfaction. We have been blessed with board members and property owners who look out for the community as a whole, seek out member input, and go out of their way not to focus on myopic special interests but on the improvement of the community as a whole in a fiscally responsible manner. Due to their focus and oversight, HHP has made incremental improvements year after year with policies, amenity improvements, publicprivate partnerships with the Town, maintaining infrastructure that kept HHP a step ahead of the competition. A committee of the Board composed of property owners has been busy working on a recommendation to the Board for the next property owner survey slated to be distributed in April of 2024. It is through these surveys that the Board gleans direction on what property owners value, how the Board and

staff are performing, and what priorities the community has for the coming years.

These are just a few points to get your started.

Holiday Safety

My friend Harry Heron mentions this as well. Be safe out there – lock the doors to your vehicles and your home, and do not leave items of value in plain sight. Wear bright clothing when biking, jogging, or walking so others will see you, especially at night. With the days shorter when you are out shopping, park in well-lit areas. Keep your car keys in your hand when you leave the store headed for your vehicle, and don't carry so many packages in your arms that your ability to take in your surroundings is compromised. Final note: if you own a weapon, please keep it in a secure location and under no circumstances in an unlocked vehicle.

I am proud to be a part of something bigger than us, united by a binding common goal of being the best residential community in the low country. I try to do my part to bring people together. Your Investment

I chose this community to nest because there is something indescribably beautiful, both in appearance and beneath the feathers, about being a part of a group of critters and humans who share something more substantial than geographical location. I have spoken with many new humans who have not experienced living in a deed-restricted community such as HHP. Domiciling in HHP has many benefits and protections. These include all the amenities, Security, programs, open spaces, clubs, exercise classes, and protection of your most significant investment, in most cases, your home. With all these benefits come obligations, which include being familiar with and following the Covenants, Rules and Regulations and contributing to the upkeep of the community via your annual assessments.

Guest Passes & Crime Prevention

One of the many techniques the Security Department employs to keep those with seclestious intent at bay is our guest pass protocols. It may seem a tad burdensome, but these measures are designed to keep criminal activity down on HHP. Guest Passes may be issued to visitors for up to (10) days via our website (www.hiltonheadplantation.com) or sixty (60) days via telephone (843)342-9980. All guests must have a guest pass called in by the host. I do ask that you please inform your visitors that they will be asked to show a photo ID at the gate to obtain their Guest Pass! This simple protocol is one of the many measures Security uses to ensure that folks entering HHP are who they represent themselves to be. Your human guests/visitors are your responsibility; they must comply with the Plantation's Rules and Regulations and Code of Conduct for Common Properties. Guest passes must be placed upward on the vehicle dashboard while you are visiting the community. The purpose of the guest pass is to authorize a visit to the specific location listed on the pass. Most hosts will not be with guests while they explore the fascinating aspects of life in the community (POA facilities). Please ensure you provide your guest with a houseguest card, and I promise HHP Security will give them the best service. Restricted passes are only good for direct access to and from the destination indicated on the front of the pass.

Celebrate

I love all the decorations, shopping, baking, and festivities that come with the holiday season. However, don't let your proverbial guard down! I advise it is most important to be safe while having fun, especially with all the extra flapdoodles and shenanigans we have all been subjected to throughout the year! Lock your doors to your home and vehicles and do not leave items of value in plain sight! Many guests will visit our beautiful Dolphin Head Recreation, so what better time to decorate with color, charm, and family traditions. Fall and winter holidays are perfect for creating elaborate outdoor scenes. During your busy holiday season, remember that the most important family traditions aren't only about immediate family and friends. If you are able, it is about giving back to the greater community.

Keeping up with the Herons

Everyone benefits from a gentrified mailbox and the neat appearance of your yard. These simple maintenance measures are a gift to your street! You will be surprised how these few focused projects will improve the look of the entire streetscape. If you have any plans to remodel or re-landscape, you'll need to contact Michele Chisolm in the ARB Department (843-681-8800 ext. 231) and discuss your ideas before proceeding with your project. Do not forget about the neighbors next door, POA open spaces, lagoons, and drainage ditches. Leaves should not be blown or deposited onto neighboring properties. This might strain a friendship, plus you'll have some unexpected cleanup work. Remember your lot lines and boundaries before you go agog with the clippers. Throwing debris in the wrong places causes more harm than good. You may feel cutting neighbors' shrubs is a kindness however such a perceived "kindness" needs to be with your neighbor's approval as they may have a slightly different perspective on the pruning of their shrubs! Don't be the reason your neighbor's prized shrub is not flowering next season. Depositing leaves and grass clipping in drainage ditches, lagoons, POA open space, or your neighbor's yard is an absolute N to the NO. These are great tips to avoid pernicious situations; if you don't break the rules, the rules will not break you.

Harry's Harp

In survey after survey, my human friends expressed their concerns regarding two prominent motor vehicle issues: **Speeding and Running Stop signs**. The pandemic put a stay on enforcement for a period of time as the Courts were closed. HHP Security officers are now back writing State of SC tickets for both of these violations. We have deployed permanent Speed Boards, and my human friends have ordered an additional portable Speed Board that can be moved to various locations as a traffic calming device. If you receive a State Ticket for Speeding or Runing a Stop sign, please do not call me and ask me to use my esoteric influence to fix a ticket.

Country Club of Hilton Head



The Fishing Club will not have a meeting in December. Our next meeting will occur on January 24 (the fourth Wednesday of the month). Meeting details will be

spelled out in the January issue of Plantation Living.

Fishing in the lagoons slowed down as the water temperature dropped. Cold water causes a lower fish metabolism, and fish activity slows down as a result. Bassmaster magazine has asked several Professional bass fishermen for hints on how they approach winter fishing- which lures are preferred and how to fish them. There is no consistent answer regarding lure selection but there is one standard piece of advice: "slow down!"

One set of suggestions, listed in order as the water temperature decreases, was to start with a lipless crankbait, then use jerk baits, drop shot shad, and then a shaky head worm. Use gold and silver lures showing "flash" and baits with trailers and skirts. That might make sense to more experienced bass anglers, but not to me. There are a lot of videos available online which explain the subject of cold-water largemouth fishing in great detail. One thing to remember is, as one presentation said, "super-super slow."

Bassmaster magazine occasionally follows a pro angler to a lake he has never fished before, then reports, almost on a minute-by-minute basis, how and with what he was fishing. A recent article detailed a 7-hour trip. In the first two hours, the fisherman made fourteen lure changes, several lasting only two or three minutes, using seven different lures. The most time, more than half an hour in total, was spent using an "umbrella" rig, a lure with five wire extensions, each with a different set of lures attached. One photograph, which showed a bit of his boat, showed what appeared to be 16 rods lying on the deck, all obviously pre-rigged. (I sometimes splurge and take TWO rods with me when fishing our lagoons.) The total catch was not reported but the top five bass weighed a total of 15 pounds, 13 ounces. It's probably not a winning total for most bass tournaments.

The club welcomes new members. Not all of our members actually do much fishing, but we find our meetings to be entertaining and educational. We continue to have a series of fine speakers who speak on a wide range of subjects. The Club's website (HHPFishingclub.com) is worth checking out!

Reminders

Move house plants indoors (inspect for insects) Still time to plant cool-season annuals, spring flowering bulbs, and woody shrubs and trees. Monitor rainfall and irrigate the lawn and trees as needed to avoid drought stress.

Feed the soil. What happens in the soil below your plants is just as important as what happens between the sun and wind above ground. Now is the best time to feed your planting so nutrients are in place and available after the last frost. Dressing indoor or outdoor plantings with compost and mulch will allow for the necessary breakdown and absorption of minerals when plants "wake up" in the spring.

The biochemical relationship between a plant's roots and the soil around them is one of nature's miracles. Plant roots produce carbohydrates which feed the bacteria and fungi in the soil. In return the bacteria and fungi stimulate the release of nutrients and minerals that are taken up into the plant. The roots of the plants as well as the organic material in the soil create pathways for air and water to support growth.

There are many YouTube videos and articles on soil health available. Just a few minutes invested in learning more about soil health will result in abundant growth and healthier plants. (Feed the soil- courtesy of Tony Paul).

Woodcarvers

Are you looking for a hobby that allows you to create beautiful keepsakes or practical items without spending hundreds of dollars just on getting started? Wood carving checks all of those boxes. It is a type of woodworking in which people use knives, chisels, and other hand-held wood carving tools to create figures or designs in pieces of wood. A wood carver's most basic tools are carving knives, such as whittling knives, chip carving knives, and hook knives. Whittling knives are all-purpose tools, while chip carving knives feature a thin, short blade that allows carvers to chip away small bits of wood. A hook knife, or spoon knife, has a bent blade shaped like a hook and is ideal for carving spoons and other pieces with hollowed-out areas. Most woodcarvers start by whittling. They find a small piece of softwood and use a pocket knife to create a toy or a trinket. Whittling is the most basic type of wood carving since the only essential tools are a wood carving knife and a honing strop. Chip carving starts with a flat piece of wood. Carvers "chip away" bits of wood to form a design on the wood's surface. Chip carvers use gouges as well as carving knives. Most woodcarvers do not build or repair furniture. They work on a much smaller scale. Come and visit with us at the Plantation House on Thursdays from 12:30 to 2:30. See if you might be "cut out" to be a woodcarver. Your grandkids will benefit from your newfound skill.

H2P2 In Action:

- Spring Lake Racquet Club (SLRC) is offering playing opportunities each week. To learn more, visit the SLRC website. Keep in mind, due to limited court availability, these events often fill up fast.


All fought hard, but the Two Tufts could not be stopped as they defeated NYPD to bring home the title.

Policies for Sport Court Usage at Dolphin Head Recreation Area:

The new Dolphin Head Recreation Area includes a multi-use sport court that is lined for basketball as well as three pickleball courts. The courts can be reserved in 1-hour increments for a fee; however, if the



courts are not reserved or being utilized, they are open to walk-on use at no charge on a first come, first serve basis. See the following policies that have been adopted by the HHPPOA Board of Directors:

- 1. The sport court can be reserved for basketball (half court) or pickleball (one pickleball court) at a rate of \$22/hour.
- 2. Court reservations can ONLY be made by HHP Property Owners or Residents with leases of 9 months or longer, and who are in good standing with the HHPPOA. The individual must ALSO be at least 16 years of age to reserve court time.
- 3. Reserved court time will be limited to 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM daily. After 6:00 PM, the sport court will be available on a first come, first serve basis with the park closing at 10:00 PM.
- 4. Reservation times will be available in 1-hour increments.
- 5. Reservations can be made online via the HHP Tennis website: www.app.courtreserve.com/portal/SLRC. Please refer to the schedule on this website to ensure when the sport court is available for use.
- 6. For those interested in reserving court time and are interested in utilizing the sports equipment in the lock box, the key can be picked up from the Spring Lake Racquet Club Pro Shop. Pro Shop hours are 8:30 AM to 5:30 PM Monday through Saturday and 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM on Sunday.
- 7. The keys for the lock box must be returned within an hour after your reservation time ends. A key drop box is located at the Spring Lake Racquet Club Pro Shop.
- 8. The sport court cannot be reserved more than one week in advance.
- 9. Participants using the sport court must wear proper athletic attire shirts/shorts/shoes. Please wear athletic shoes with non-marking soles.
- 10. Foul language and uncivilized conduct will NOT be tolerated.
- 11. Use of bicycles, scooters, roller skates, inline skates, and skateboards is prohibited on the sport court.
- 12. No pets are permitted on the sport court.
- 13. Report problems to the Spring Lake Racquet Club Pro Shop at 843-681-3626. After-hours: Report problems to HHP Security at 843-681-2459.
- 14. Fees will be incurred if the sports equipment is lost, stolen, or damaged OR if the key to the lock box is not returned.
- 15. Any HHP House Guest utilizing the sport court should have a valid HHP House Guest Card in their possession while using the amenity.
- 16. Individuals using the sport court do so at their own risk.
