



Coffee with Peter

The November Coffee will be held on Thursday, November 16, 10:00 AM, at the Plantation House. This will be our final Coffee of the year and will celebrate HHPPOA's 50th Anniversary with special appearances by our Past Presidents and other special guests, as well as a celebration of all that our Property Owner Volunteers have accomplished. On Thursday afternoon, November 16, we will conduct official tours of the building and grounds of the newly renovated Dolphin Head Recreation Area. Please see the section of my column that provides times and guidance to make your visit to this wonderful new amenity more productive and enjoyable.

Leah Davis has been busy interviewing all the HHP past presidents who are still with us for our 50th anniversary celebration on November 16, 2023. Each past president has been asked to talk about the board's accomplishments and the community's experience during their presidency. I happened to be around for the past president from 1996-1997. His statement about HHP was not an eye-opener but verified the sentiments I often receive as comments but don't necessarily hone in on these exact words. He said, and I paraphrase Hilton Head Plantation is unique in so many ways, but the most evident feature is the authentic sense of community that neighbors and the staff possess, as they genuinely care about each other and look out for each other. This was not something that was implanted by the developer, even though the concept of a residential community was promoted and fostered in what has become a world-class resort for visitors. We are a community where folks care more about relationships, the good of the entire community and helping each other than their own pet projects or "this is how we did it where I came from." His comments hit home and are still quite evident a guarter of a century later. You will enjoy the video snippets of all of the past presidents that will be part of our 50th celebration at the Plantation House.

278 Corridor and Bridge Project

As you may be aware, a new traffic light is now operational at the intersection of 278 and Windmill Harbor. Please exercise caution when approaching this new installation. The long-term impact of this Beaufort County recommended installation has yet to be determined.

Support Local Businesses

During the shoulder seasons, especially if you do have the occasion to eat out or require a service provider for a repair or other need, keep in mind our local establishments. Our local restaurants survive during the winter months on the patronage of Island residents. Service providers also depend on Island residents to keep them going during the off-season. Please consider patronizing our local businesses.

Dolphin Head Recreation Renovations

We have finally come to a completion date and will conduct tours of the newly renovated building, grounds, and associated accruements. We are very grateful to Wood+ Partners for their design work, Tim Probst, the architect who designed the new building, and Nix Construction for building this unique addition to HHP's repertoire of fine amenities. The site includes

a new Recreation Center Building with generous outdoor deck spaces and a screened-in porch. The interior of the building features a warming and catering kitchen area with substantial indoor floor space for Clubs, POA Special Events, and private gatherings. New bathrooms that will be open during the day for use are also included. The building is equipped with video surveillance equipment, Public Address system, and TV monitors in the conditioned space in the main room and porch area for presentations. The Event Lawn and main trellis area can be used for outdoor gatherings, special events, and weddings. The site also includes a Picnic Shelter, a Hard Surface Sports Court, and an enhanced path system. A new state-of-the-art playground is also part of this new amenity's offerings. The hard surface sports court is lined for both basketball and three pickle ball courts. The parking lots for both Pine Island and the Dolphin Head Recreation area have been upgraded and renovated.

The new Dolphin Head Recreation Center and Picnic Shelter will tentatively be available for private rentals around December 1, 2023. Please Check with Jen at the Scheduling Office located at the Plantation House (843)-681-8090 for availability. On Thursday afternoon, November 16 we will be hosting tours of the Building and Grounds. So as not to overwhelm the site, we ask folks with last names starting with A-L to come for their tour from 1:00-2:30 PM and property owners that have last names ending in M-Z arrive for their tour from 3:00-4:30 PM. The Board and staff are excited to share this new renovation with the community.

Staying Safe!

Reminders--especially during the holiday season: please lock the doors to your vehicles and home. Do not leave items of value in plain sight. If you own a weapon, you have a special obligation and responsibility to keep that weapon under lock and key so it is not accessible by individuals with ill intent or by young ones who do not know how to safely handle a weapon. Do not forget to close your garage door at night. We want to make it as difficult as possible for folks with ill intent to make a living in HHP.

With daylight growing shorter, please consider burning your outdoor lights for both security and safety. If you are out walking, jogging, or biking when it is dark, please wear bright colors or use an electronic device to make you more visible to motorists, fellow pedestrians, and cyclists.

RV/Boat Storage Area

As reported earlier, this amenity has been totally renovated, with about 30 spaces still available for annual leasing. Please see my good friend Harry Heron's Column for more details on this topic. The Board has approved a new gate system for the RV/Boat storage area entrance, which will provide improved security and video surveillance capability for those entering and leaving the area. We still have about a dozen items that no one has come forward to take ownership and/or responsibility for past-due rent. If we do not locate the owners with the proper credentials by December 31, 2023, these items will be appropriately disposed of by HHPPOA.

Our Love and Sometimes Discord with our Tourists

Once again, the busy tourist season is behind us. We locals, including the overwhelming majority of HHP residents, are enjoying and looking forward to a respite from all the traffic and inconvenience of living in a world-class vacation resort destination. Like you, I have adapted to overcrowded restaurants

and, in some cases, restaurants with less staff or restricted hours due to the abundance of visitors and lack of workers. Beaches that we thought were reserved exclusively for island residents quickly filled up with tourists. Timing is everything on Saturdays during the height of the season; it is especially challenging going off the island in the morning and coming back in the afternoon as we compete with the tourists leaving in the morning and the new crop of tourists coming to our Island home in the afternoon.

As a reminder to our veteran residents and to bring up to speed our many newcomers, while inconvenient, we all need to consider a few factors next time we get behind a slow-moving tourist or find out there is a one-hour wait for a table at our favorite restaurant. We were all most likely tourists at one time who had yet to learn where we were going or where to find our well-hidden shopping centers and other amenities. The truth is that our visitors are collectively responsible in part for the lifestyle we enjoy as full-time property owners on Hilton Head Island. Tourists pay the Accommodations Tax that supports the Arts Center, Honey Horn Plantation, The Annual Car Show the Concours d'Elegance, Beach Renourishment, the Gullah Museum, the Hilton Head Choral Society, Hilton Head, Hilton Head Dance Theater, Hilton Head Symphony Orchestra, Main Street Youth Theater, Mitchelville Preservation Project, Native Island Business & Community, the Boys & Girls Club, to name a few.

Rental properties pay the full 6% Beaufort Property Tax, which includes the taxes that fund most of our school budget. (The exception is personal property taxes on cars, RVs, boats, etc.) All these funding mechanisms paid either by tourists directly or indirectly by owners of rental properties benefit the full-time property owner residents by helping keep our taxes low. The overwhelming majority of HHP residents are full-time property owners and benefit directly from tourism.

When you are out and about and get behind a lost tourist who fails to signal when they suddenly make a right-hand turn or clog up your favorite restaurant until 9:00 PM remember they are helping pay for our lifestyle. These folks will someday want to move to HHI and may even purchase your home. There is no doubt tourists are an inconvenience at times; however, the totality of their impact, not just the inconvenience, needs to be factored into our assessment of our many visitors.

As a community, we overwhelmingly voted to limit short-term rentals in HHP because we wanted to maintain the residential character of our neighborhoods. However, we are all ambassadors for our great Island home, and even if annoyed by all of the above, we all have an obligation to roll out our adopted or long-standing southern hospitality and make our visitors feel welcome and at home.

Short-Term Rental Amendment

Some time ago, the HHP community voted for a covenant amendment that limited short-term rentals to leases of six months or more. The provisions of this amendment have been in place for well over five years. As we have many new property owners who have recently purchased in HHP we want to reiterate the provisions of the Short-Term Rental Amendment that was passed by the community back in 2018.

LEASING REQUIREMENTS

Lease Terms. A Single-Family Dwelling Unit may be leased only in its entirety; no rooms or fractions of a Single-Family Dwelling Unit may be leased. There shall be no subleasing of a Single-Family Dwelling Unit or assignment of a lease without prior written Board approval. All leases must be for a term of at least six (6) months, except with written Board approval.

Compliance with Association Documents. The Owner must provide the tenant/Occupant of the Single-Family Dwelling Unit copies of the Association Documents. The terms of the Association Documents are deemed to be incorporated into each lease or other occupancy agreement for any Single-Family Dwelling Unit, whether or not expressly stated therein, and into the terms of any tenancy or other Occupancy arrangement even if no written lease or agreement exists between the Owner and the Occupant.

The Owner and each Occupant shall comply with all provision of the Association Documents. The Owner and Occupants are responsible for violations by any Guests of the Single-Family Dwelling Unit and may be sanctioned for any such violation.

If a Single-Family Dwelling Unit is leased or occupied in violation of the Association Documents, if an unauthorized Lease or Occupancy arrangement is entered into for the Single-Family Dwelling Unit, or if the Owner, Occupant, or Guest violates the Association Documents, the Association shall be authorized to take all enforcement actions against the Owner and/or Occupant.

Short Term Leasing. Short Term Leasing is expressly prohibited.

Turkey Trot

A reminder that Thanksgiving is just around the corner, and with Thanksgiving comes Turkeys, and with Turkeys comes the annual Turkey Trot. On Thanksgiving morning, some of our roads will be used for the Annual Turkey Trot sponsored by the Island Recreation Center. The 5k run starts at Skull Creek Boathouse at 8:00 AM. Runners will come through the Cypress gate and runon Seabrook Drive to Whooping Crane Way. Once on Whooping Crane Way, they run back to the Cypress Gate, retracing their steps back to the Cypress Gate to the finish line. The Route was changed to impact fewer total streets and neighborhoods and provide more alternative routes around the event. If you are traveling on Thanksgiving morning, please plan on using the Main Gate between 8:00 am and 10:00 am to avoid delays. This is a great family event and is open to all residents of HHP. For more information on how to sign up for the Turkey Trot, give the Island Recreation Center a call at (843) 681-7273.

This event will cause delays along Seabrook and Whooping Crane Way. Please schedule your morning activities and errands accordingly, as traffic will be held up in these areas to allow for the safe passage of the participants in the Turkey Trot. This event is among the many ways HHP gives back to the greater community. It also allows us to showcase HHP to many individuals who have not been able to pay a visit.

This month's compendium includes: "Slow! LOOK! LISTEN, DECORE! and Harry's Harp of the Month."

It's me, your sagacious pre-holidays Covenants Bird, dispensing advice/information from my bird's eye view 200 feet above the friendly skies of HHP. I try to keep everyone mindful of things you may not be cognizant of and/or refresh your recollection. Here are some key issues and recommendations I feel compelled to share, along with other promising practices. As we head into the holiday season, I am here to assist

with collaborative strategies to help you negotiate what can be a stressful part of the year. I am committed to supporting you and imparting phronesis in a puckish manner devoid of excessive hubris! I just love HHP during the holidays!

"Slow Down!"

If you own a car, you know, at times, it gets crazy out there. Visitors don't know where they are going; folks don't know how to use a traffic circle, and my favorite motorist gripe – SPEEDING! Driving is part of your everyday life, whether you're going to work or running errands. Driving over the speed limit or too fast for "conditions" is not only dangerous, but it is also illegal. Please, no texting while driving, and please admire all the holiday decorations at a slow speed, paying attention to what is in front of your vehicle. It is essential to pay attention to your speed on the road. Speeding can result in not only accidents but also serious legal consequences for the driver or responsible party. The purpose of speed limits is to protect residents and guests. Whenever drivers fail to obey the speed limits, they pose an unnecessary safety risk for everyone in the community. Driving at 40 mph on a road where the limit is 30 mph might save you a few minutes, but it also increases the chances of an accident. Safe drivers understand they must share the road with other drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists. They know they cannot control all situations but can control their reactions to situations. "For Harry's Sake," please use your turn signals to telegraph your intentions to make a turn! Taking these few preventive measures can help save lives. Sometimes, our actions, or those of others around us, can put us in danger or make driving and riding unpleasant and stressful.

Never forget! At some point in the day, everyone is a pedestrian. Be especially on the lookout for our Turkey Trotters on Thanksgiving morning! We must pay attention to what is going on around us. To keep yourself safe as a pedestrian, remember a few feather-tip rules. As a cyclist, you may have the right to be on the roadways, but you must choose which risks are worth taking where visibility is key. Whether on a bicycle or driving on our roads, you are subject to the same rules as a motor vehicle. Even if you are obeying traffic signs and signals, remember that motorists might not notice you, so wear bright clothing or use an electronic device to make yourself more visible to motorists. Taking in these helpful reminders can help keep you and everyone around you safe.

Holiday Decorations

During my flights above HHP this time of year, I am all in agog, taking in all the ornamentations and the chimerical atmosphere that my human friends have provided as gifts to the streets. Remember to keep your decor and associated doodads in good

taste and error on the side of white or clear lights in December. Can't wait to don my blinking lights for my holiday flights and escorting Santa's sleigh on his Christmas Eve run.

Harry's Harp of the Month-RV/Boat Storage Area

I played an integral role in the gentrification of the RV/Boat Storage area, which is located adjacent to the POA Compound. I am so excited about the new experience of traveling through this area. Many abandoned items had to be removed to allow the roadways to be leveled, trees trimmed, and weeds subdued. The spaces have been renumbered and a few interlopers had to be removed. As many of my human friends know, recreational vehicles and boats are a costly investment. For this reason, security is a top priority, which can sometimes be difficult to achieve in a garage or driveway. The space problem is easily solved using an RV/Boat storage facility. Having your RV, boat/ trailer, or travel trailer sitting in your driveway overnight will certainly detract from your home's curb appeal, and it is also violating the POA governing documents, so it makes sense to take advantage of the benefits that an RV/Boat storage facility provides. The recreational vehicle or equipment must be owned or leased by the property owner. Renters will be given a temporary access code to open the automated gate (please do not give out the code to your friends). For safety reasons, contractors and their employees are not permitted in the storage area. My friends at the POA have taken a lot of time and effort to organize the area to make it more convenient and efficient for you, our residents, to lease space. Security personnel monitor this area for infractions of these regulations and take appropriate enforcement action. One of my confidants at the POA just informed me that a new RV/Boat Storage Gate system has been approved for installation. The new system will have video surveillance capabilities and will provide other tighter security measures. The POA still has a very limited number of spaces for lease. - Home birders willing to listen for their neighborhood owls in the evening


Complete directions for all roles are provided. We do have participants who enjoy being part of a Field Group as well as watching their own yards that day.

The SC Department of Natural Resources has published its regulations for this year. There are no changes regarding fishing; no catch or size limit changes. There is one boating regulation addition regarding boaters born after July 1, 2007. Boaters in this age group are required to pass an approved boater education course before operating a boat, jet ski, or other powered watercraft.

Licensing regulations remain the same. A saltwater fishing license is required for all persons aged 16 and over. Licenses are available at locations such as Walmart and Dick's. A Senior Lifetime license is available for South Carolina residents over the age of 64 who have resided in South Carolina for 180 days. The cost is \$9.00. These licenses must be obtained directly from the DNR (SCDNR.gov). That license covers both fresh and saltwater fishing. While a license is not required to fish in HHP freshwater lagoons, there is local freshwater fishing in Jarvis Creek Park or Seargent Jasper Park in Hardeeville (Accessible from US 278 just before I-95), where a license is required. (DNR regulations clearly state that no license is required when fishing in a privately owned pond.)

Our freshwater ponds have been classified as "Catch and Release" only. All fish must be returned to the pond where they were caught. Saltwater species caught in Spring Lake, Bear Lake, and at Port Royal Sound at Pine Island may be kept, providing they satisfy state regulations regarding size and catch limits. It is the angler's responsibility to know these limits. Each year, the Kids Kamp staff have the children make thank-you cards for our volunteer work during their fishing sessions. This year's cards were given to the Club for viewing during our September dinner meeting. What an amazing collection of grammar, spelling, and artwork! None of the cards topped one from several years ago, though, when a youngster's card said "Fishing is boring, boring, boring, until you hook someone" That's why we pinch the barbs on the hooks.

- 6. **Rescue** The amazing work of rescue dogs is well documented, whether they are operating on land or sea. A great example is the work of dogs who rescued survivors of the 911 bombings, leading humans to safety.

- 8. **Transport** Hard-working sled dogs have been used for centuries to transport humans and goods in cold, snowy climates.
- 9. **Policing** Police dogs act as partners of their handlers, tracking and capturing criminals or sniffing out drugs or explosives at airports and border crossings.
- 10. **Guard** Various breeds are trained to protect public or private property. Canines are one of the most cost-effective security measures. December 23. Create a gift basket of assorted jams and local honey-the jams are all homemade by club members from figs and berries raised on the farm. Stock up on honey — all of it is local from Hilton Head Bees! Give a sweet taste of South Carolina!

In addition, we have a lovely assortment of fresh veggies, including kale, carrots, broccoli, lettuces, radishes, arugula, bok choi, collards, mustard greens, turnips, etc. – all are grown on-site and picked the day before or the day of sale. Come early - there is a limited amount of veggies, and they sell quickly. Hopefully, we will have citrus! Proceeds from the sales help the farm club maintain the property and equipment.

The Importance of pH

The pH of your garden soil, its acidity, neutrality, or alkalinity, greatly impacts the outcome of your gardening efforts. The right pH for fruits, vegetables, flowers, etc., can mean the difference in your harvest or blooms. Now is the best time to test your pH in anticipation of the next growing season, as it will allow needed soil amendments time to work their way into the soil.

For example, the pH of a blueberry patch was between 5 and 5.5. The



accepted pH level for flowering and fruit sets of blueberries is between 4.5-5. So an application of an organic soil acidifier was made to lower the ph.

There are several soil testing kits online, including the Environmental Concepts Soil Test Kit from Amazon. Besides pH, this kit tests for Nitrogen (N), Phosphorus (P), and Potash (K). For information about Clemson Cooperative Extension Service's soil test service, go to hgic.clemson.edu. (contributed by Farmer Tony Paul.)

Woodcarvers

Are you looking for a hobby that allows you to create beautiful keepsakes or practical items without spending hundreds of dollars just on getting started? Wood carving checks all of those boxes. It is a type of woodworking in which people use knives, chisels, and other hand-held wood carving tools to create figures or designs in pieces of wood. A wood carver's most basic tools are carving knives, such as whittling knives, chip carving knives, and hook knives. Whittling knives are all-purpose tools, while chip carving knives feature a thin, short blade that allows carvers to chip away small bits of wood. A hook knife, or spoon knife, has a bent blade shaped like a hook and is ideal for carving spoons and other pieces with hollowed-out areas. Most woodcarvers start by whittling. They find a small piece of softwood and use a pocket knife to create a toy or a trinket. Whittling is the most basic type of wood carving since the only essential tools are a wood carving knife and a honing strop. Chip carving starts with a flat piece of wood. Carvers "chip away" bits of wood to form a design on the wood's surface. Chip carvers use gouges as well as carving knives. Most woodcarvers do not build or repair furniture. They work on a much smaller scale. Come and visit with us at the Plantation House on Thursdays from 12:30 to 2:30. See if you might be "cut out" to be a woodcarver. Your grandkids will benefit from your newfound skill.

Policies for Sport Court Usage at Dolphin Head Recreation Area:

The new Dolphin Head Recreation Area includes a multi-use sport court that is lined for basketball as well as three pickleball courts. The courts can be reserved in 1-hour increments for a fee; however, if the courts are not reserved



or being utilized, they are open to walk-on use at no charge on a first come, first serve basis. See the following policies that have been adopted by the HHPPOA Board of Directors:

- 1. The sport court can be reserved for basketball (half court) or pickleball (one pickleball court) at a rate of \$22/hour.
- Court reservations can ONLY be made by HHP Property Owners or Residents with leases of 9 months or longer, and who are in good standing with the HHPPOA. The individual must ALSO be at least 16 years of age to reserve court time.
- 3. Reserved court time will be limited to 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM daily. After 6:00 PM, the sport court will be available on a first come, first serve basis with the park closing at 10:00 PM.
- 4. Reservation times will be available in 1-hour increments.
- 5. Reservations can be made online via the HHP Tennis website: www.app.courtreserve.com/SLRC. Please refer to the schedule on this website to ensure when the sport court is available for use.
- 6. For those interested in reserving court time and are interested in utilizing the sports equipment in the lock box, the key can be picked up from the Spring Lake Racquet Club Pro Shop. Pro Shop hours are 8:30 AM to 5:30 PM Monday through Saturday and 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM on Sunday.
- 7. The keys for the lock box must be returned within an hour after your reservation time ends. A key drop box is located at the Spring Lake Racquet Club Pro Shop.
- 8. The sport court cannot be reserved more than one week in advance.
- 9. Participants using the sport court must wear proper athletic attire shirts/shorts/shoes. Please wear athletic shoes with non-marking soles.
- 10. Foul language and uncivilized conduct will NOT be tolerated.
- 11. Use of bicycles, scooters, roller skates, inline skates, and skateboards is prohibited on the sport court.
- 12. No pets are permitted on the sport court.
- 13. Report problems to the Spring Lake Racquet Club Pro Shop at 843-681-3625. After-hours: Report problems to HHP Security at 843-681-2459.
- 14. Fees will be incurred if the sports equipment is lost, stolen, or damaged OR if the key to the lock box is not returned.
- 15. Any HHP House Guest utilizing the sport court should have a valid HHP House Guest Card in their possession while using the amenity.
- 16. Individuals using the sport court do so at their own risk.



Please bring items wrapped in a towel or market bag so Tom can easily keep things organized. Also be sure to leave a good contact number with Tom as he will text or call you when your items are complete and ready for pick up later that same day. There is a maximum of 5 items per RSVP, with a minimum of 3 items, but scissors can be additional to the 5 items. Dull edges are dangerous! So, we want you to have happy, sharper edges.

Items sharpened:

Knives, scissors/shears (both household/fabric/industrial and stylist/groomers), and garden implements (clippers, loppers, etc.).

Tom will take stylist/grooming shears with him to sharpen, and then he will deliver/return them the next day. Household, fabric, industrial type scissors will be completed at the event.

Pricing:

Pricing is variable as Tom will need to view the items. You will pay him directly. Kitchen knives average about \$15 each, though it varies with length, condition of edge, broken points, etc. Garden clippers and loppers range from \$5-\$20+, again dependent upon condition of edge, length, etc. Household scissors approximately \$15+, stylist/grooming shears \$35+. Bring your items and Tom will assess them. Cash, Checks and Credit Cards are accepted - Cash is king.

Tom's background information: Tom has been hand sharpening his own and family/friends' knives since he was 13 years old. He has advanced to a nifty belt sharpening system, and he is at a whole new level! He has been doing Sharpening Events and Farmers Markets on Hilton Head Island, Bluffton, and Port Royal for 3+ years and getting great results with many repeat customers.
